The long banner in our sanctuary proclaims, "A city on a hill cannot be hidden...let your light shine," and that is exactly what takes place the first and third Wednesday of each month right here at Immanuel. "Put Your Hands Together" food distribution ministry is becoming a beacon to the community. God is being Glorified as we Impact our Community by showing mercy to our neighbors. We may not see the fruit of our labors, but God shows his love to all people through this ministry. We still need volunteers so please sign up through Sign-Up Genius.

Thank you for supporting the ministry of ILC. With your tithes and offerings, we are able to proclaim the name of Jesus in a variety of ways. A number of you have transitioned to on-line giving in the wake of the pandemic and your regular offering is much appreciated. If you do not know how to give online, you can contact Pastor Deombeleg or Joanna Czubernat to help you get started. Some of you prefer to mail in your offering and that is totally fine.

During Sunday worship we are working our way through readings from the Book of Romans. Our series is titled, "God's Greater Story." Romans is jam-packed with words of encouragement, hope, and assurance. Join us to see how you fit into God's Greater Story.

Last year we formed a team to oversee proposed audio-video upgrades to the sanctuary. Funds were made possible through a personal gift from one of our members. The upgrades have been installed and Immanuel is no longer technologically challenged. The upgrades will be apparent to those worshiping in the sanctuary as well as those worshiping from home. In the sanctuary you will see two High Definition screens that are much easier on the eyes, and a rich sound system bringing all things audible to life. At home, we will be able to livestream the service to you in a much-improved audio-video format which will be very noticeable. This will happen once training is completed by our A/V team; it shouldn't be long.

The faculty and staff of our school, Immanuel Christian Academy, through the leadership of Valerie Winston, our Principal, have been working very hard to ensure that the upcoming school year will continue to operate at the highest level possible. They did a wonderful job of adapting to the crisis that changed our world. Enrollment for this coming year is looking very good. I thank God for our teachers and have the highest admiration for them as they went above and beyond their normal duties. Most of them had to learn how to teach their students in a completely different environment. Please keep them in your prayers as they plan for the new school year that already poses great challenges requiring more work and resources.

I wanted to share good things that are happening at Immanuel before addressing the elephant in the room. Clearly, so many people are weary and feel burdened by all that is going on in our world. It is difficult to try and make sense of all the dynamics involved when a nation is going through a revolution. There are no easy answers. What we can do is go the cross, to trust in our Lord and pray for peace in our land. That is the vertical aspect, calling out to the Lord. Jesus also calls us to love our neighbor (Matt 22:39). Love is a verb, therefore, love for the neighbor looks at the neighbor, sees a need, and then takes action in order to meet that need. Jesus is directing us outside of ourselves to the needs of others. That is the horizontal aspect. We cannot solve the world's problems, but if we show this kind of love to others, share the story of Jesus, and pray for them, God can do the impossible. "The Lord is near to all who call upon him" (Psalm 145:18).

Let us pray. Father in heaven, in this time of great unrest, open our eyes to needs of others, to show them mercy and compassion, to shine the light of Your Son. Give us words to speak, energy to serve, and wisdom to help all who are in need, all people of all backgrounds, languages, and cultures. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Stewards of Our God-given Vocations

The Pocket Bible Dictionary defines vocation as "a calling based on God's purpose and grace (2 Timothy 1:9). The Apostle Paul urged believers 'to walk worthy' of their Christian vocation (Ephesian 4:1)." God has given each of us different vocations. At birth, we were given the vocation of being a child. Many of us have brothers and sisters, so we have the vocation of being siblings. If we marry, we have the vocation of spouse, and, with children, we have the vocation of parents. Our place of residence makes us citizens of our neighborhoods, cities, counties, states, and our country. Our work is a vocation. At baptism, we are given the vocation of being Christian.

As God's people, we see our vocations as gifts from God, and, with His help, we can honor Him in each of our vocations. The Apostle Paul tells us "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him" (Colossians 3:17). Jesus should accompany us in every vocation of life. In each of our vocations, we have a responsibility to do our best and show God's love in all that we do. For example, as a married person, I am to love and cherish my spouse. As parents, we are to provide for the physical well-being of our children and most, important, help them to grow in their relationship with Jesus. To walk worthy, as Paul encouraged, implies that we are to be God's representatives in all of our vocations. In our homes, neighborhoods, places of work, and churches, we are, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to reflect God's image and values in each of our vocations. God's image reveals a spirit of kindness, patience, love, and generosity. We are to bring good to others and glory to God in order that His kingdom might advance.

Our careers or places of work are what we reference most when we think about vocations. To work and have a vocation is a wonderful gift from God. Pastor Tony Evans in his book *Kingdom Stewardship* tells us that we are to "stop leaving God at church. Take Him to work. He wants to be part of the widgets you are making, letters you are typing, businesses you are building, and entrepreneurial risk you are taking. He wants to be a part of the education you are pursuing. He wants to climb the ladder with you."

Our vocations are truly our calling in life. Vocation is much more than our jobs or where we work to earn a living. Our vocations are the places where the Lord has stationed us to love and serve our family, friends, and all people. Our vocations bind us together in loving relationships. These are the relationships that God calls us to steward.


