## Our Thanksgiving Journey

For what are you thankful for? Off the top of your head, you may not think of anything. Then again, you might think of many things. Did you think of your body and soul? How about family and friends and all your material possessions? For all these things we should thank and praise God.

Have you ever done a lot for someone who didn't show any appreciation? You probably weren't too happy. Luke tells us that something like that happened to Jesus (17:11-19). Ten leprous men were miraculously healed but only one returned to give Jesus thanks and praise. Jesus asks him, with a hint of disappointment in his voice, "Where are the nine?" How often are we like the other nine, forgetting to say thanks for the wonderful gifts we've received from God?

All ten men believed in Jesus but only one of them, a Samaritan, remembered who it was that had healed them. Only one of them saw the God of creation at work in his own life. This one leper saw God in this man Jesus of Nazareth and returned to give thanks and praise to that God. He rejoiced, not only in the healing of his sin, but also in a healing that made him part of a community again. He was now reconciled to God, forgiven of his sins, and given new life. Jesus tells the man to leave his worship and continue on the journey of faith. "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."

Today, many people give thanks for material blessings. Even people who normally have little or nothing to do with God will say, "Thank you." But will they continue thanking God when the situation has passed? Maybe, but then again, maybe not. Even you and I sometimes find ourselves weak when it comes to thanking and praising God. We tend to be better askers than thankers. "God please do something! Get me out of this bind! Give me some relief! Make us happy!" Many times, we ask for our daily bead, but then forget to thank God when we get it.

And we do have many reasons to give thanks! Consider again the ten lepers. Jesus healed all of them of an incurable disease. But only the Samaritan recognized the healer behind the healing. Only one of the ten recognized the giver behind the gift. He believed not only that God healed him, but also that this God was Jesus of Nazareth. The foreigner believed and returned to thank and praise. Thanksgiving flowed into worship.

Jesus may not have healed us from leprosy. But he has healed us from something much greater. Jesus died for us on the cross to deliver us from the disease of sin, death, and of the devil. You and I, who suffer from the human disease of sin, have been healed. That's more than enough reason to thank and praise God! That thanks and praise flows out in worship.

So, for what are we thankful for? There's almost too much to count! All our material blessings, being made children of God and heirs of heaven, our school, freedom to worship the one true God, to glorify Him and Impact our Community. These are all gifts we have received and continue to enjoy. Thanks and praise to God in Jesus Christ! "Give thanks to the Lord, call on his name; make known among the nations what he has done!" (Psalm 105:1). As your pastor I am very thankful to God for each of you for all many ways you bless me. Let us give thanks to God every day as we journey through this life filled with His wonderful gifts.

### Blessings on Your Stewardship Journey

### **Giving Sacrificially**

Sacrificial giving can be defined as "giving something we love to something or someone we love even more." We value our time and money, yet we are willing to give them away in our service to our Lord, because of our love for Jesus, our Lord and Savior.

Through faith, we understand that God is the source and owner of all things and any success that we have financially is made possible by God. It is God Who gives us the ability to make and earn money. 'Beware lest you say in your heart,' My power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth.' You shall remember the Lord your God, for it is He Who gives you the power to get wealth..." (Deuteronomy 8:17-18).

Our giving gives evidence of our relationship with Jesus. Of all the tools that Satan may consider using to separate us from an intimate relationship with Jesus, money is his best tool. Our love for money and the things that money can buy can become stronger than our love for the Lord. The writer of Hebrews admonishes, "Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with

what you have..." (Hebrews 13:5). Paul warns Timothy, "For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pangs" (1 Timothy 6:10). If we love money, we can be separated from God just as the Rich Young Man was because he was unable to part with his fortune (Mark 10:17-22).

When we have a proper attitude and perspective toward what we own and when we, with the help of the Holy Spirit understand Who God is and what He has done for us, we are empowered to give sacrificially. Sacrificial giving represents the depth of our love for the Lord. As the writer of Hebrews wrote, "Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God" (Hebrews 13:16).

"Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7).

The foundational truth for our stewardship is that God is the owner. We are stewards, not owners. He has created all things, and He has never relinquished His control and ownership over His creation. We may verbally acknowledge God's ownership with our lips, but do our actions show that we act as owners rather than stewards? As God's stewards, we have the responsibility to seek to determine what God wants us to do with what He entrusts to us. May we not only seek to know God's will but may we also desire to do it.



Martha became so upset that she complained to Jesus and wanted Him to correct Mary's vision. While Martha was not wrong in wanting to be of service to Jesus, she was wrong in choosing that moment to do so. Jesus told Martha that Mary was making the right choice in that moment.

Jesus is telling us that there is a right time and place for everything. There is a time for both service and stillness, a time for doing and a time for being. We need to find that balance in our discipleship and in our lives. When our vision is corrected and focused on Jesus, the blurriness and fogginess becomes clear.


